

Divine Mercy Chaplet and Lenten Lamentations will be held on Sundays at 3:00PM, followed by Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament. Monday of Holy Week, April 10 Mass will celebrated at 8:00AM. No Noon Mass.

Liturgical Reflection...Saint Paul states, "Husbands, love your wives, as Christ loved the Church and gave Himself up for her, that He might sanctify her" (Ephesians 5:25). Giving Himself over on the Cross out of love for us, Christ is the supreme model of self-giving love. "For this reason a man shall leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, and the two shall become one. This is the great mystery, and I mean in reference to Christ and the Church" (Ephesians 5:31-32). Married life is intimately tied to the Cross of Christ. During the fifth week of Lent, DICE – instruments of chance, and a seamless GARMENT are placed at the foot of the Cross. Everything had to be, to fulfill all that the Scriptures said about the Messiah.

**Matthew 27:35** – When they had crucified Him, they divided His garments, rolling dice for them to see what each should take.

Luke 23:24 – They divided His garments, rolling dice for them.

**John 19:23-24** – After the soldiers had crucified Jesus, they took His garments and divided them four ways, one for each soldier. There was also His tunic, but this tunic was woven in one piece from top to bottom and had no seam. They said to each other, We should not tear it. Let us throw dice and see who gets it. The purpose of this was to have the Scriptures fulfilled – They divided My garments among them; for My clothing they cast lots. (Psalm 22:19). And this is what the soldiers did.
