Liturgical Reflection...With the Order of Celebrating Matrimony without Mass, the rite consists of the Liturgy of the Word and the Celebration of Matrimony. There is no Penitential Rite or Glory to God. The regular Scripture readings offered for the celebration of Matrimony are selected. There is always a homily. Following the Universal Prayer, the concluding prayer is the Lord's Prayer. Omitting the "Deliver us," the Nuptial Blessing is prayed over the newly married couple. When two Catholics are married, there may be Communion outside Mass. Also, the local customs of placing a flower before the image of the Blessed Mother, giving flowers to the mothers of the Bride and Groom, and introducing the newly married couple may take place. 2017, Diocese of Altoona-Johnstown, Liturgy Office, 925 S.
